- 2. Any one of the Modern Indian Languages or Modern Foreign Languages or any Classical Languages or Information technology.
- 3. Any four Subjects carrying 100 marks each.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate std XII examination with vocational subject conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Boards of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education with the following subjects: 1. English,

- 2. Any one vocational subject carrying 200 marks prescribed by the board from time to time.
- 3. Any three subjects carrying 100 marks each.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School certificate Std XII examination with the minimum competency based vocational courses conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education with the following subjects.

- 1. English
